

THE PRESBYTERY. Parishioners are aware that I have been working with the Diocese to rationalise the accommodation in order to make it a more practical house for letting. The garage will be converted into a Parish office with a loo suitable for those with mobility challenges. Planning was granted on 16th July. The property will have an open plan kitchen-living room, a utility room, study, snug on the GF; 3 bedrooms, two bathrooms (one en suite) on the first floor. There will be two parking spaces in front of the existing garage. Access to the house will no longer be up the existing steps (which will go) but up steps westwards to a pathway into the southern elevation of the house. The top end of the garden and The Shrine will be retained for parish use and fenced off. **Financing.** The work is expensive because the internal walls of the Presbytery are solid and some will be taken away. There is also asbestos removal, new drainage and plumbing, new fittings, fees, etc. The architect has detailed estimated costings but not yet prepared a tender document. The house itself is likely to cost in the region of £90,000 including VAT; the Parish Office and WC around £47,500; the garden £6500; fees £10,170. Total: just under £155,000. The parish will provide some capital; the rest of the money will be lent to us by the diocese at 3.25% interest. It is expected that rental income will be in the region of £1500 pcm; £18,000 gross/annum. Allowing for repairs and

management, rental income should allow us to be debt free in 8 years, after which the income would come to the Parish. (We may raise money to shorten the repayment time). This is a big undertaking. The parish Finance committee invite all parishioners to view the Presbytery, inspect the plans, look at the cost estimates and ask questions, together with a glass of wine, after the Assumption Mass which takes place at 7 pm on Thursday 15th August. I hope that it may be possible to have someone from the Diocese Property Office with us.
