FINANCES. Our small Finance committee met last Wednesday to look at the first 7 months of the year compared to 2019. Our treasurer, Veronica Wilson updated us: The **Offertory plate** income is down 60% but the Standing Orders (parishioners who pay regularly each month or quarter) is only down by a few hundred pounds. In all, our gift income is down 30% but it could be much worse. **Donations** (money received from people who wish to help the Church, payments from Funeral directors, Mass intentions, and all sorts of other gifts, is up from just under £2000 in 2019, to over £5000 so far this year. Thank you, all you kind people. Total Expenses including professional fees for the Presbytery, maintenance of buildings, admin, parish 


[FINANCES cond..... about £1000 down on this time last year. But the **big challenge** will be to raise the £15,000 that we banked from the May Fayre (£4.700) and the Auction of Promises (£10,500) – (just over £15,000) in 2019.

We shall also be hit by £40,000 coming out of our account for the Presbytery building work. (The remainder is being borrowed from the Diocese). The property should be starting to provide income by January 2021, and that will cover interest and capital repayments on the loan over a 5-7 year period.

I would like to thank so many generous people who keep us afloat financially.

This coming week we celebrate two glorious northern saints: St Aidan (died 651), who converted the Anglo-Saxons in Northumbria and who founded a monastery on the island of Lindisfarne, and **St. Cuthbert** (634-687) – possibly England's most popular Northern Saint, whose body lies in Durham Cathedral, who was also a monk and Bishop of Lindisfarne. The Venerable Bede, (673-735) historian and saint, provides us with details of their lives. **PRAYER OF ST AIDAN**: 'Leave me alone with God as much as may be. As the tide draws the waters close in upon the shore, Make me an island, set apart, alone with you, God, holy to you. Then with the turning of the tide prepare me to carry your presence to the busy world beyond, the world that rushes in on me till the waters come again and fold me back to you.'
